President's Message: This Election, Vote Like Your Health Depends on It

BCNU President Adriane Gear's latest message to members speaks to the importance of nurses' voices in the Oct. 19 provincial election and what's at stake. We need to elect candidates who are committed to investing in our public health-care system and reject proposals for privatization and cuts.

We encourage you to talk to family members, friends and neighbours and make sure they are aware of nurses' key concerns including the severe staffing shortages that are closing emergency rooms, cancelling surgeries, impacting care delivery, and leaving seniors alone without adequate care.

To support this effort, we've produced a <u>pamphlet</u> that will help you start conversations about the health policy priorities that matter to nurses.
